This year we plan to offer 20 different educational seminars covering residential, commercial, external structures, and municipal topics. Attendees can earn up to 20 continuing education credits.

"When Disaster Strikes" Course Scheduled for June 2018

As a result of PENNBC's first successful offering of the "When Disaster Strikes" training course at the 2017 conference, the Education Committee has decided to offer it again as a stand alone course in June 2018.

Tentatively, the training will be offered on *June 26-28, 2018*, at the Red Lion Hotel, 4751 Lindle Rd., Harrisburg, PA.

This seminar provides participants with skills, knowledge, and tools to help them become a Disaster Response Inspector. Participants will learn the ICC Disaster Response Process, which will enable them to respond to a disaster site prepared to interface with the onsite command structure and become a resource in identifying unsafe buildings and uninhabitable structures.

Space will be limited at the training course to the first 50 registrants.

PENNBC offers four different member classes to accommodate everyone's employment situation: Active, Associate, Corporate, & Student Members.

At the 2017 General Meeting, the "Active Member" class was expanded to allow more individuals to qualify. The new language purposely omitted "employed", "contracted" and "third party" because ICC simply mandates that you must administer, formulate or enforce codes for a governmental entity. Quantity Discounts:

An employer's first five "Active Members" are billed at the standard \$85 per person rate. The sixth and beyond "Active Members" are discounted to \$55 per person.

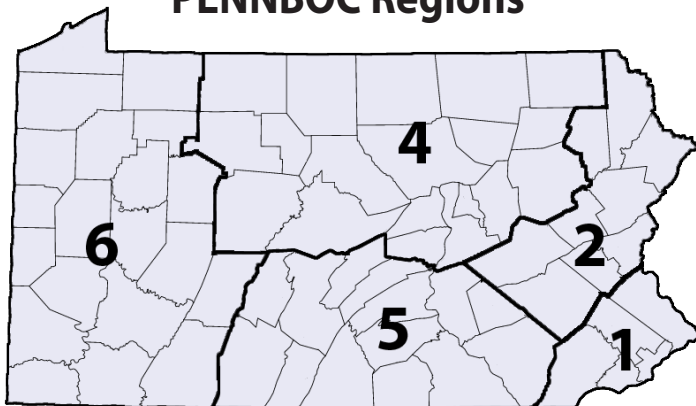

PENNBOC Member Classes

Active – Any person whose primary duties involve administration, formulation or enforcement of laws, regulations or ordinances relating to public health, safety and welfare for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, or a political subdivision thereof, including joint and multi-municipal agencies. Examples of these primary duties include, but are not limited to the PA Uniform Construction Code, Zoning Codes, Property Maintenance and Housing Codes, and Fire Codes. Active members may vote, hold office and chair standing committees, in addition to participation rights afforded to other classes of membership. (\$85 per person.)

Associate – An associate member is an individual who does not meet the requirements of an Active member. Associate members have no voting privileges. (\$85 per person.)

Student – If you attend school, at any level, studying building trades, design, construction or fabrication, you qualify for student membership. (\$15 per person.)

Corporate – The corporate member category is for commercial (for-profit) entities with an interest, indeed a commitment, to the issues of importance to the code community. *Individuals and municipalities cannot be corporate members.* Those concerned with the code adoption process, the products which code officials encounter in their day-to-day “enforcement” activities, and the products employed in the tasks of code enforcement would also find this classification of interest. Corporate members may designate up to three individuals to serve on committees, participate in discussions and attend PENNBOC events at the event’s member rate. Corporate members have no voting privileges. Representatives are named when dues are paid and may be changed once during the dues year. (\$100 per company.)
